GENERAL TRAVEL

Can-Ar Coach runs daily from Haliburton, Minden, Miner's Bay, Moore Falls, Norland, Lindsay, Oshawa, Toronto and back. Full schedule: www.can-arcoach.com

EMPLOYMENT / COMMUTERS

If you are looking for work, Fleming CREW Employment Services is a great resource. Speak with your Employment Counsellor about what transportation supports might be available. **Fleming CREW Employment Services:** 705-457-2020

You may be eligible for employment supports to help get you to work if you are receiving social assistance (Ontario Works or ODSP). Speak with your caseworker to learn more. If you have a disability, you may still be eligible for employment benefits from ODSP *even if you don't qualify for income supports*. Call ODSP to find out more.

COMMUNITY SUPPORTS / CRISIS SERVICES / SOCIAL SERVICES

Many programs in the community can work with you to overcome transportation barriers. If you are looking for mental health supports, victim's services, counselling, parenting groups, or social services, it is worth calling the agency to talk about options.



MEDICAL

HHHS Community Support Services offers several transportation services for medical travel for seniors and adults with disabilities. Call at least 72 hours in advance.
